This review is designed to inventory the USI's accomplishments and make recommendations for the future.

Testing

- Through the efforts of Laurie Cigan, an ILeap refresher class offered through Accuplacer and MyFoundationsLAb was offered to students (starting in 2013) who placed in underprepared classes. USI was looked into this "bookcamp" type offering to help students start one level ahead and was privy to the beginning of the program. The Testing Center provided underprepared students with all the information needed to access the class. Very few students took advantage of the opportunity. Those who did, however, scored one level ahead of their original placement. This program has been discontinued due to lack of student by-in.

Student Completion

- Much time was spent looking at trends and curriculum. Members not only discussed changes and the need for OER, but many actively gathered and utilized materials (Stephanie Polliard).
 Active learning strategies were also a focus.
- Three sections of Mat 140 were added to the schedule. USI member Maribeth Marquard worked on this addition as it allows students who struggle with math and need a slower pace to have an option besides Mat 142.
- Julie Olander, in a quest to aid underprepared students created a Canvas Module designed to help students master chemistry concepts.
- Kim Dean piloted the District Math Modules and will be training 08X/09X instructors with the new curriculum and competencies.
