Description: In this session, we will talk about setting up Outcomes and Rubrics at the account/sub-account level to establish a framework for assessments and competency reporting. By doing this at the beginning of the semester or term, we are poised to easily attach them to Assignments and Question Banks in courses throughout the year.

Intro to Outcomes

Outcomes allow the administration and faculty to track mastery in a course. You can import Account, State, and Common Core Standards into your course. You can create nested outcomes by dragging and dropping outcomes to create structure. This can be done at the account, sub-account or course-level.

Use Outcomes to:

Focus students' attention on the most important skills and activities in your course

Align Quizzes and Assignments to different kinds of mastery

Run reports at the account-level about student artifacts of learning mastery

Align accreditation or other standards to programs of study, courses, or student assessments

1. Demonstrate Literacy in Literary History

Students should be able to meaningfully discuss and write about significant **themes and ideas**; major **events and figures**; and **literary genres** (as listed in the "Core Standards for English 291 a" document) by referring to representative texts and authors.

2. Demonstrate Critical Analysis

Analyze Critically. Interpret literary works critically. This includes

- Thematic analysis
- Linguistic, rhetorical, and formal analysis
- Performance and multimedia analysis
- Historical analysis
- Application of literary and cultural theories

Intro to Rubrics

A Rubric is an assessment tool for communicating expectations of quality. Rubrics are typically comprised of rows and columns. Rows are used to define the various criteria being used to assess an assignment. Columns are used to define levels of performance for each criterion.

- Align pre-defined learning Outcomes to your course assessments.
- Assess online submissions in the SpeedGrader™.

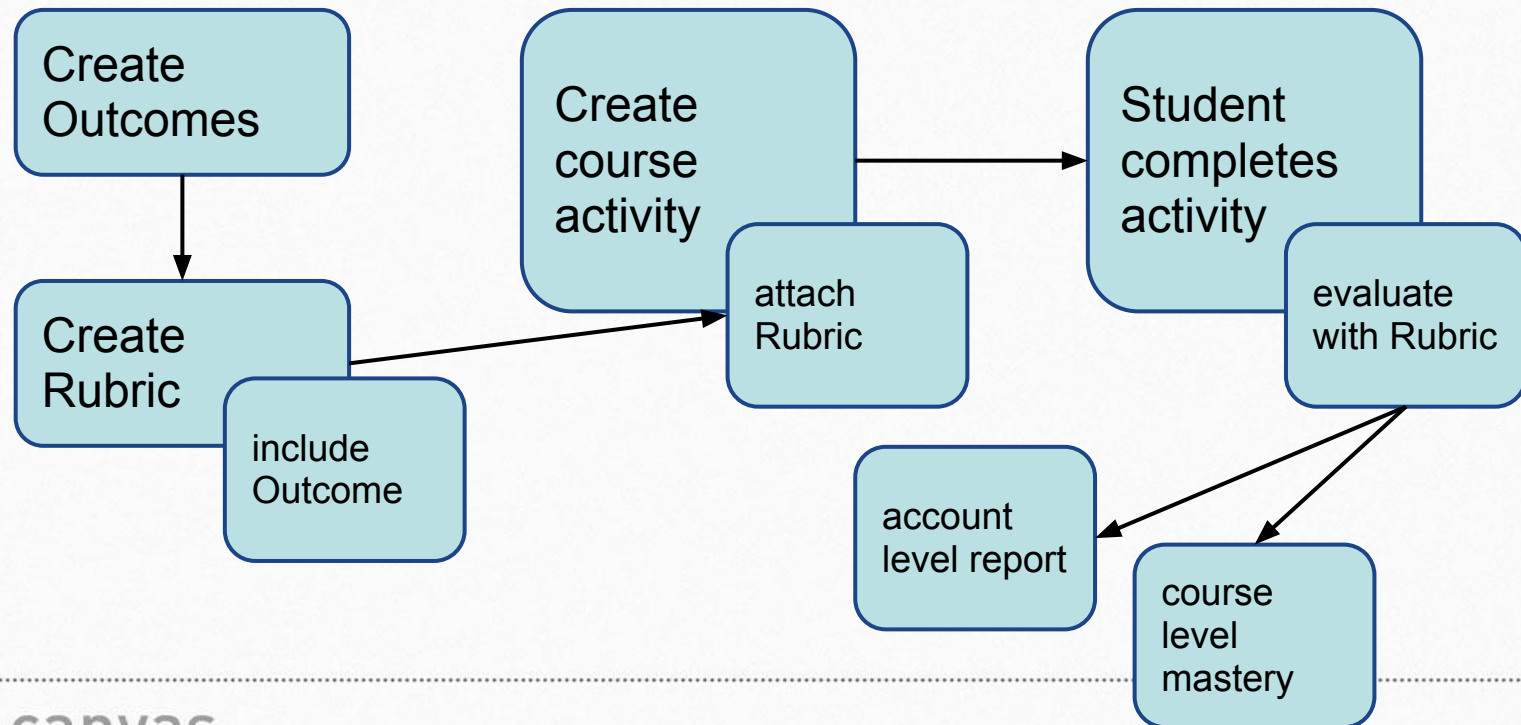
Using Outcomes, Rubrics

First create the Outcomes and Rubrics (ideally at the account level)

Create graded activities - discussions, assignments, or quizzes

Search for and apply the Rubric.

- If the Rubric already includes the Outcome - done
- If the Rubric does not include the Outcome - add the Outcome



Competency reports

Generating reports at the **account level**

The Student Competency Report is accessible for download at the account level.

NOTE: For detailed reports, create outcomes at the account or sub-account level and add those outcomes to course activities. Course level Outcomes are not included in the report.

Student Competency ✕

This report shows the learning outcome results for all students. The resulting csv file will have one row per user-outcome-result pair, and will show the details of the result including the associated assignment.

Outcomes (Mastery) reports

Viewing Outcomes data at the course level

The Instructor can go to their course roster, click on a student name, and select the Outcomes button on the right. A tabular display of data is displayed listing assignments connected to outcomes, the assignment score and the mastery level.
